

## AHR Disposition and Trainability Test Obstacles

### Riding Test

1. Ride over four or more logs or poles. These can be in a straight line or zigzagged. Walk-overs will be 20-24 inches apart. Trot-overs will be 36-42 inches apart.
2. Carry an object from one part of arena to another.
3. Back through and around poles, pylons, barrels etc. An L back through must have 30 inches minimum space between poles. Back throughs around barrels or pylons must be separated by a minimum of 40 inches.
4. Cross a safe and sturdy simulated wooden bridge.
5. Put on and remove a slicker.
6. Open and close a simple rope gate.
7. Do a 360 degree turn in six to seven foot square box.
8. Approach a mail box and allow rider to take mail out of the box.
9. Pass between poles, hay bales etc.
10. Walk, trot, halt, back, and canter or lope a prescribed pattern.
11. Cross a line marked on the ground.
12. Stand for 10 seconds in a prescribed area.

### Driving Test

1. Stand tied quietly for 1-5 minutes
2. Walk, trot, halt and back a prescribed pattern.
3. Cross a line on the ground.
4. Serpentine or cloverleaf pattern around pylons or barrels.
5. Drive through barrels, cones, hay bales etc.
6. Drive through a U or L or I\_I .
7. Pass by a diversion like a running engine, guy pushing a wheel barrow, stroller, umbrella, bicycle, trash can etc. Bicycles may not come up behind a horse.
8. Back into a box or between pylons.
9. Pick up mail at a mail box.
10. Cross a simulated wooden bridge.

### In Hand Class

1. Handler puts on and takes off a slicker.
2. Put a sheet or plastic slicker over horse's back.
3. Back a horse through poles, barrels or pylons with 40 inches between poles or cones.
4. Back a horse between poles, barrels, or pylons then halt horse and walk it forward.
5. Load into a trailer with a ramp.
6. Walk a horse into a box or circle made of ground pole, lime, or spray paint turn it around in a 360 degree circle and walk out.

7. Walk by a diversion like a running engine, guy pushing a wheel barrow, stroller, umbrella, bicycle, balloons, trash can etc.
8. Walk or trot over ground poles. Handler will not walk over the rails but will lead from the side.
9. Walk over a simulated wooden bridge with the handler at the side of the bridge.
10. Lunge horse at a walk and trot in a circle (either or both directions) and demonstrate stopping.
11. Side pass over a rail. Handler may touch horse.
12. Back through an L, I I, or U shaped obstacle or through cones or barrels.
13. Stand horse quietly on a loose shank while audience claps.
14. Ground tie by placing lead on the ground a walk a ten foot circle around horse.
